INTRODUCTION OF HUMAN PAPILLOMAVIRUS VACCINE INTO THE CHILDHOOD IMMUNISATION PROGRAMME: ANNOUNCEMENT OF VACCINE TO BE USED.

I am writing to let you know which vaccine will be used in the new HPV (human papillomavirus) immunisation programme, starting at the beginning of the 2008/09 school year.

The contract to provide the vaccine has been awarded to pharmaceutical company

GlaxoSmithKline for their vaccine Cervarix . The vaccine will be provided to Health and Social Care Trusts for the routine and catch-up immunisation programmes taking place from autumn 2008 to 2011. Stocks of HPV vaccines will be supplied via designated Trust Pharmacy Departments. The vaccine will be supplied as a single dose pack. Further guidance on vaccine supply management

I want to re-emphasise that given the high cost of vaccines, Trusts should ensure that they have robust stock management systems in place to minimise waste.

Each 1% of vaccine supplied in the current childhood immunisation programme is worth approximately £2m. This could increase to nearer £3m with the introduction of the HPV vaccine. Even small percentage reductions in vaccine wastage will have a major impact on the financing of vaccine supplies.

Trusts are asked to advise the Department what systems they have implemented to manage and control vaccine wastage.

More information will be provided regarding transporting and storing HPV vaccine at immunisation sessions as soon as possible. Further discussion, including with the manufacturer, is required on this issue and we do not wish to delay the vaccine announcement meanwhile.

Any queries on local Trust supply and distribution arrangements should be made to the relevant Trust Pharmacy Department. The Regional Pharmaceutical Procurement Service (Tel: 028 9055 2386) will provide information on availability and distribution of central supplies of the HPV vaccine to Trust Pharmacy Departments.
