PATHWAY OF CARE FOR PATIENTS WITH BRUCELLOSIS

Northern Ireland has recently experienced an outbreak of brucellosis in the cattle herd. As a direct consequence the incidence of human disease has risen with 89 cases reported during the period 1998-2003.

Brucellosis is now a rare zoonosis and few doctors have experience of managing the disease. It was against this background that a multidisciplinary working group developed the Pathway of Care. This aims to describe evidence-based practice and combines information on the epidemiology of the infection with advice on therapy, referral and follow-up.

The Pathway targets primarily general practitioners involved in managing an individual who suffers from brucellosis. As it may also be relevant to consultant physicians, and other health care professionals. I would ask Medical Directors to bring it to their attention.

The Pathway has now been published on the Department's website <u>www.dhsspsni.gov.uk/phealth/index.asp</u>. You should note that hard copies have been made available to Directors of Public Health in areas where the risks are highest.
