Question:

- Can you tell me how many times correspondence has been received by the Department in a language other than English?
- How many times has the Department received a correspondence in Irish?
- How many times has the Department received a correspondence in Ulster Scots?
- Can you give me these figures for the years 2016, 2017, and the year 2018 up to June 30.
- These to include both letters physically written to the Department and letters sent to the Department by email.
- Can you tell me how much money was spent on translation services for dealing with correspondence in this period, both on translating correspondence sent to the Department and providing responses?
- Can you tell me who was paid to provide translation services whether this was paid to someone working within the Department or to an external organisation paid to carry out the work.

Response:

Records from 2016 to 30 June 2018 indicate that only one correspondence, in a language other than English, has been received by the Department. This correspondence was a letter (received by e-mail in 2016) in Irish. The correspondence and a draft response was translated by an external organisation at a cost of £68.40.

No communications in Ulster-Scots or other languages are recorded.
